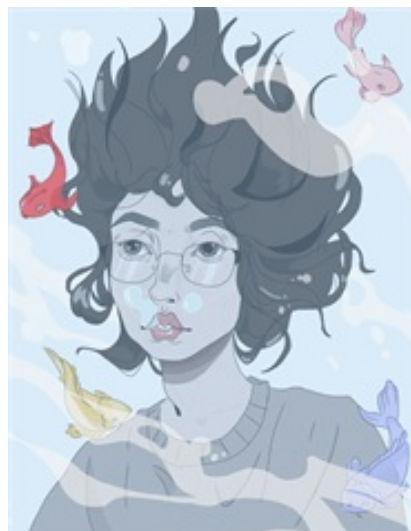
Holland Community Opera Fellowships - deadline Jan. 1, 2022

Opera Omaha is seeking teaching artists to join the Holland Community Opera Fellowship Team for the 22/23 Season. Artists of any discipline who have an interest in impacting community and an understanding of how their art may engage with opera are encouraged to apply.

Launched in 2017, the Holland Community Opera Fellowship leads the opera field in civic practice - building deep relationships outside of the performance venues. A team of Holland Community Fellows are engaged each season to bring their skills as artists and trained civic practitioners in service to individual creative growth within partner organizations, through a combination of long- and short-term co-created programs.

This program is not only for singers and programming is focused on creativity and inspiration with the art form of opera as a toolbox.
