He served as the Supervisor of Music for Lincoln Public Schools and teaching appointments included Associate Professor of Music at Doane University, instrumental music teacher at Lincoln East High School, Norris Public Schools, and Kimball Public Schools in Nebraska.

He has served in various leadership positions including President of the North Central Division of NAfME and President of the Nebraska Music Educators Association. He has served on various boards including Lincoln's Symphony Orchestra Board of Directors, the UNL Hixson-Lied Performing Arts College Alumni Board, and the Abendmusik Board.

Federal Arts Advocacy Update

Nationwide advocacy efforts helped produce the following outcomes in the FY'24 Senate Appropriations bills:

- **\$207 million each** for the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) and the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) (no cuts in funding from FY'23 and consistent with the caps of the Debt Ceiling deal).
- \$18.6 billion for Title I-A, which includes funding for well-rounded programs to support Arts Education (\$2 billion increase from FY'23)
- **\$1.4 billion** for the Title IV-A block grant which can be used for arts education programs both in schools as well as for after-school programming. (Slight increase)
- **\$2.19 billion** for Title II-A for professional development for school faculty, including arts educators (Level funding with last year's FY'23 appropriations).



NDE and Nebraska Arts Council partner for Arts NOW Grant Program

The Nebraska Department of Education and Nebraska Arts Council are excited to announce their partnership to bring the Arts NOW Grants to Nebraska's public schools.

Arts NOW Grants are for arts education projects in Nebraska schools. This special grant program will only be available for SY 2023-2024. Arts NOW is a competitive grant program supporting arts education projects that help students in grades K through 12 achieve artistic excellence while implementing **Nebraska's Fine Arts Standards**.

Each school district in Nebraska is invited to submit one application describing their project and the impact it will have on their students and arts education in their school. Based on the number of students impacted, public schools districts may apply in one of three funding tiers.

Applications are due by Friday, October 13, 2023.

Apply Now to OCF's Nonprofit Capacity Building Program

Through dynamic professional development activities and executive coaching

sessions, the Nonprofit Capacity Building programs helps nonprofit leaders of color strengthen their organization, expand their network, and amplify their impact in the community.

Up to 10 leaders will participate in a 10-month curriculum designed to unpack and uplift their unique experiences while also increasing their organizational and leadership capacity. Participants will receive a \$5,000 grant for personal and organizational development.

The program operates with the understanding that nonprofit leaders are best suited to identify and address the needs of their organization. To support these efforts, Omaha Community Foundation offers resources that include cohort-based peer learning, diverse coaches and facilitators, and personal and professional development coaching, as well as workshops on infrastructure, governance, and operations.
