

Born and raised in Omaha, her work spans across multiple platforms in efforts such as grassroots journalism, startups, politics, non-profit partnerships, arts and culture. Corpuz believes that storytelling expands universal empathy and builds connection within the community. She currently hosts Riverside chats, a local public radio show, as well as other events around the community.

## **Legislative Updates**

Nebraskans for the Arts is monitoring a variety of bills in the current legislative session. Key bills we are engaged with are:

- LB605 Arts Therapy Certification, moving forward
- LB1067 Inheritance Tax which could impact the use of Visitors Promotion/Improvement Funds
- LB1413 Transfer and provide for the transfer of funds by State Treasury; one of those funds is the Civic & Community Center Fund which will impact grant funding for Creative Districts in 25-26.

### **Midwest Youth Poet Laureate**

The Nebraska Writers Collective (NWC) is pleased to announce that the Youth Poet Laureate (YPL) of Nebraska, Aliyah American Horse, has been appointed the Midwest Youth Poet Laureate! American Horse will serve a one-year term.

She is now one of four, teen finalists in the country vying for the National Youth Poet Laureate title, which was once held by 2021 Inaugural poet, Amanda Gorman. She will perform



her original poetry on the Kennedy Center Stage on April 20, 2024 with the chance of returning home as the 2024-25 United States Youth Poet Laureate.

American Horse says, "To be titled the Midwest Youth Poet Laureate is such an honor and blessing. I am so grateful to have the opportunity to be able to speak up about the battles Native American communities face everywhere."
