AiS/C grants provide funds to hire artists from Nebraska Arts Council's <u>Artist Roster</u> to lead interactive sessions conducted online or in-person.

In these sessions, artists share their expertise through creative and educational demonstrations, performances, or guided arts activities. Sponsors can hire an artist for school or community visits consisting of three sessions or a residency consisting of 10 or more sessions.

Wanting to take your students to the arts? Then apply for a **School Bus** for the Arts Grant!

This program provides grants for students from kindergarten to 12th grade to underwrite the cost of field trips to attend professional arts

exhibits at museums of other venues.

Field trips may also include learning opportunities such as theatre workshops led by professional artists. Allowable expenses include transportation, admission fees, and associated workshop fees, if applicable.

Elizabeth performed two poems for her recitation: *Drowning in Wheat* by Meg Day, and *August 12 in the Nebraska Sand Hills Watching the Perseids Meteor Shower* by former Nebraska State Poet, Twyla Hansen.

As state champion, Elizabeth received a \$200 cash award and a free trip to Washington. Her school, Marian High School in Omaha, also received \$500 toward the purchase of poetry materials.
