Additional Comments from the candidate:

I have my master in urban planning with a specialization in economic development and have worked for nonprofit arts organizations as a career. I have done research, advocated for, and executed community economic development through arts programming and it's something I regularly talk about when I'm going door to door. I wrote the Shovel-Ready Act and targeted for nonprofit arts organizations because I knew it would be a qualified class under arpa (which didn't exist yet) and I know the economic impact and return on investment. Arts and culture is our highest return on investment because it's been so neglected in Nebraska.
