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




-NebraskARTS Awards: Nominate a School-



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What do annual music outreach programs in Winnebago, Arts Across Nebraska touring performances, and the Nebraska Theater Academy all have in common?

They are all supported with a grant from the Nebraska Arts Council with funding from the National Endowments for the Arts.

Each year a music educator leads from the Omaha Conservatory of Music leads classes at the St. Augustine Mission School in Winnebago, professional performing artists go on the road to rural communities across the state, courtesy of the Lied Center for Performing Arts, and 85 schools throughout the state participate in master classes, competitions, and an awards showcase, sponsored Omaha Performing Arts.
